To meet project goals — attract talented staff, support workplace well-being and productivity, and inspire innovative and collaborative problem solving — material and visual connections with nature were primary to the biophilic design strategy for this renovation. The curving wood wall with exposed grain made

from sustainably harvested yellow birch; the kitchen/lounge countertop crafted from timber salvaged from the bottom of a local river; meeting rooms and workstations that emphasised a balance of privacy, natural light and views to the exterior; and the carpet tile pattern, reminiscent of crashing surf and made from salvaged fishing nets, each contributed to the LEED Gold and WELL certification.
